

Volunteer Program Update

Yamato Scrub Natural Area - Eagle Scout Project Saturday, March 31, 2007

Eagle Scout candidate Steven Sengberg, along with Department volunteers and members of Boy Scout Troop 315, helped the Department of Environmental Resources Management plant 500 cutthroat grass seedlings along a wetland area in the north portion of this 217-acre natural area located in Boca Raton. The scouts also planted 40 saw palmettos and strangler figs along the cement walking trail. The final step in the project was installing 1,800 feet of irrigation tubing to bring water to the newly-planted native vegetation.



Steven (above right in the white hat) and the volunteers planted endangered cutthroat grass along the edge of a wetland area in Yamato Scrub Natural Area. Not only did they install more than 500 plants, they also installed irrigation to keep the plants watered during the dry months.
